With 2013 behind us and 2014 ahead of us, there is much to be done for the cause of Christ here in Brazil. This new year will present many new challenges as did the last. Yet, we are confident the Lord will lead and guide us as He has thus far. As we plan and set goals for the year, we are reminded that God is in control. We must be patient and wait on the Lord as we press on for Him.

The first Sunday of the month we invited, Pastor Jefferson, a Brazilian missionary to India, to share his work in our Sunday morning service. Though we did not have many people that day, it was a blessing to hear what the Lord is doing in India.

Of all the Brazilian missionaries that we meet or hear about, it is very rare to hear of a missionary from Brazil to a foreign field. We have tried to encourage any such missionaries that we hear about. Because there are fewer solid churches and little commitment to support the work of the Lord, it is difficult for these foreign missionaries. We have prayed for years and continue to pray that God would raise up more missionaries from Brazil to reach the lost around the world.

In February we will have another missionary with us. He will be visiting the area to research what cities and areas would give access to Indian tribes in surrounding reservations. We plan to visit five specific areas in the state. Please pray that the Lord would lead and guide in this research. There are isolated tribes not very far from us that have no Gospel presentation.

May the Lord reward you for your time spent praying, your money invested in giving, and the time spent communicating to us that you are lifting us up before the Lord!
